7. Confidentiality & Publicity

- Details whether the owner can disclose information about the production.
- May restrict public sharing of behind-the-scenes content.

8. Termination & Cancellation

- Outlines circumstances where either party can cancel the agreement.
- Specifies any notice period required for cancellation.

- **Read the Agreement Thoroughly** – Ensure you understand all terms before signing.
- **Clarify Any Uncertainties** – If any clauses are unclear, seek clarification from the production company.
